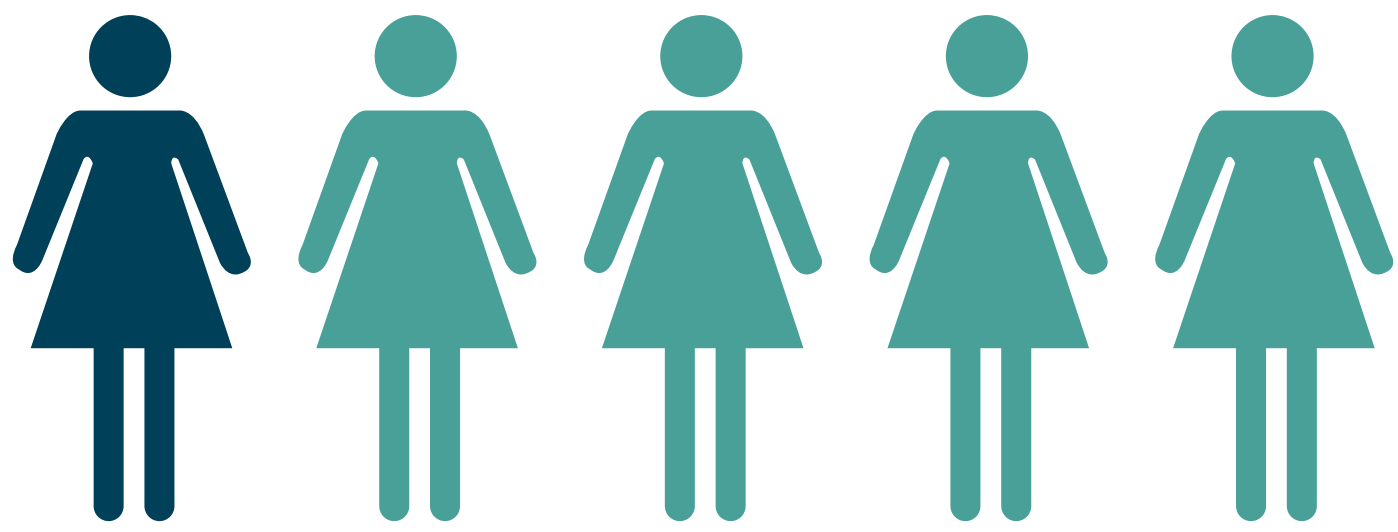

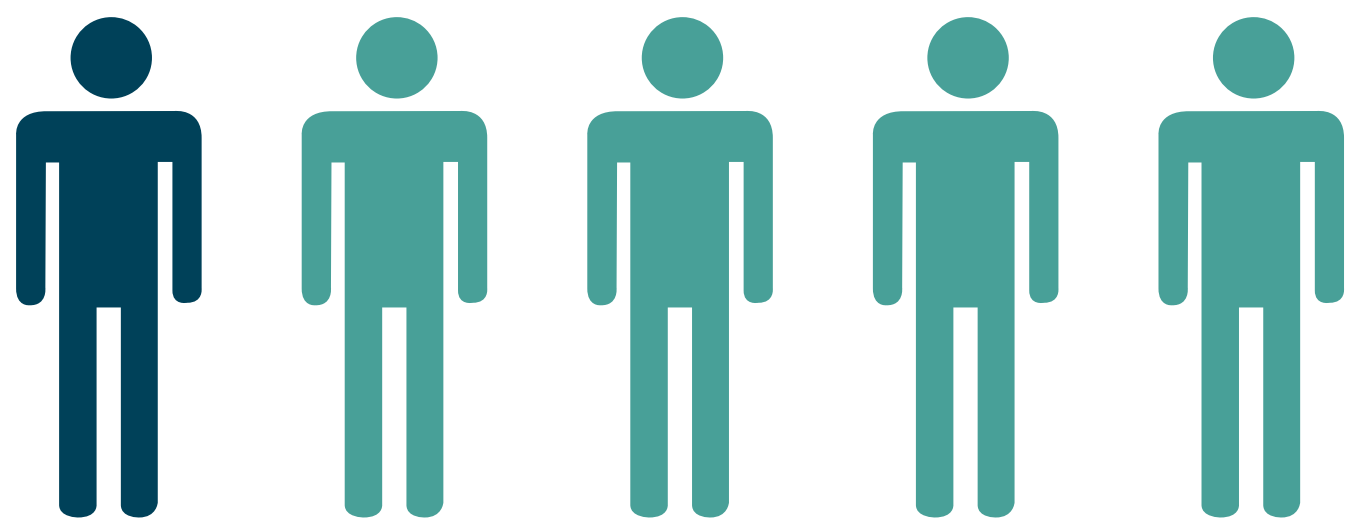
Teenage Sexual Assault

experience sexual assault, a rate similar to college.

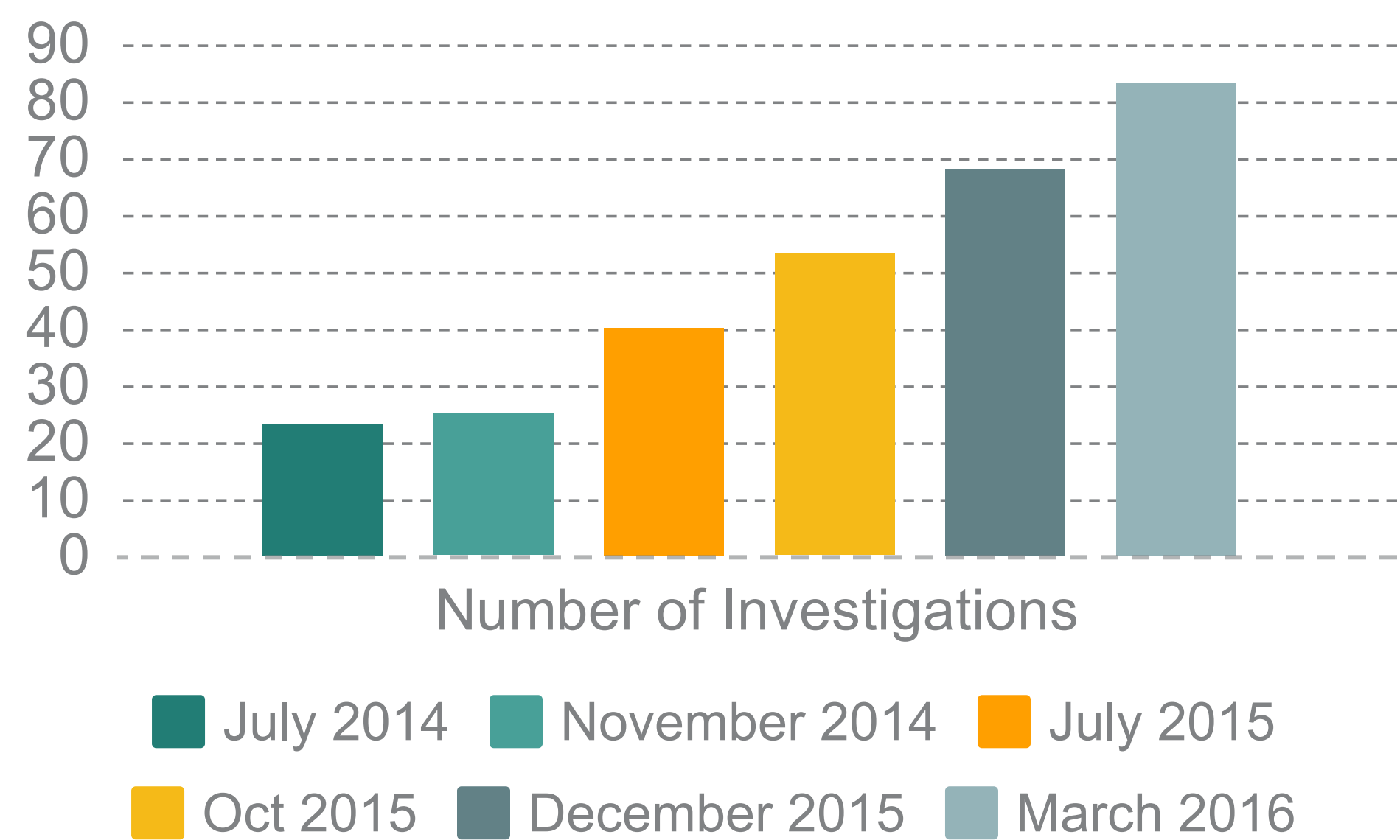


1 IN 10 MALE STUDENTS
